Deep Sea Fishing

As the sky brightens in the east, Malindi wakes up. While local fishermen return with their nets, deep-sea fishing enthusiasts gather to board the dinghies that take them to the boats. There, crews are already busy warming up the engines and checking the gear for a day packed with adrenaline and high expectations.

- **Malindi's Record:** Renowned as the richest area for Sailfish on the entire coast, it boasts impressive statistics: over 15,000 Sailfish and Marlin have been caught here in the last decade.
- **Variety:** In addition to "billfish," the waters teem with Wahoo, Kingfish, Barracuda, Yellowfin Tuna, and Sharks, ensuring an exciting and varied catch.
- **Seasonality:** The peak season for Sailfish runs from September to March (during the North-East monsoon). From April onwards, the waters are dominated by Kingfish, Dorado, and Barracuda.
- **Standards and Safety:** All boats are affiliated with the **MWCBA** and the **Malindi Sea Fishing Club** (affiliated with IGFA), guaranteeing international safety standards and the official registration of world records.
- **Tips:** Soft drinks are provided on board. For a snack, we recommend ordering a "packed lunch" (sandwiches) from your resort. Don't forget sunscreen, a t-shirt, and a sarong for sun protection.





Golf Club

Kenya is one of the few places in the world that offers all the ingredients for a perfect golf vacation. With **40 golf courses** (13 of which are 18-hole), it offers world-class fairways set against breathtaking landscapes.

- **Year-Round Play:** Thanks to its equatorial location, the climate is ideal every month of the year. Even during the rainy seasons, showers typically occur in the evening or early morning, rarely interrupting a game.

An Exclusive Experience: Golfing here pairs beautifully with charming lodges and wildlife safaris; it is not uncommon to spot wild animals near the greens of the 53 nearby national parks and reserves.





Horse Riding

Located on Malindi beach near the golf club, the **Riding Centre** features a stable of Arab-African horses. Experience the thrill of riding along the shoreline with the sound of hooves splashing through the waves. These horses are extremely docile, making the excursion perfect even for those who have never ridden before...



Kitesurf Watamu

Welcome to the fourth most beautiful beach in the world. This corner of East Africa—famous for its vast savannahs and the "Big Five"—also boasts a stunning coastline with pristine lagoons and wild reefs, making it a "cult" destination for kitesurfing trips seeking wind, waves, and adventure.





Diving: The "Underwater Safari"

Kenya is rapidly becoming a premier destination for divers. Beneath the turquoise surface of the Indian Ocean lies a habitat as rich and diverse as any land-based wildlife park.

- **What to See:** Beyond tropical fish, you can spot **dolphins**, giant groupers, and barracudas. During migratory periods, majestic **whales** pass close to the outer reefs.
- **Top Sites:**
 - **Caves and Chimneys:** Volcanic paths that allow divers to emerge through a 10m "chimney" directly into the heart of the reef.
 - **Kisite Mpunguti Marine Reserve (South of Mombasa):** The best spot for sighting giant **Manta Rays**.
 - **Nyulli Reef:** For experienced divers; features strong tidal currents, spectacular corals, Zebra Sharks, and Napoleon Wrasse.

Visibility: Diving is possible year-round, though visibility may decrease in July and August due to rougher seas stirring up sandbanks.
